Choral Services

Our main service of the week is at 6pm on Sunday evening. This is a service of Choral Evensong with an address, and is followed by drinks in the ante-chapel. Choral Evensong is also sung by the choir on Thursdays at 6.30pm.

Contemplative Services

Tuesday nights are when we hold contemplative services. Depending on the term, this may be traditional Compline, a contemporary Soulscape, or a reflective Holy Communion. These services are followed by port and hot chocolate in A1.

Said Services

From Monday to Friday, morning prayer is said in the chapel at 8.30am. On Monday and Friday evening prayer is said at 5.30pm.

Special Services this Term

Sunday 4 May	Eucharist and Lighting of the Easter Candle (10am) We celebrate Easter by lighting the Paschal Candle with a flame brought from a local church. Afterwards, all are welcome to breakfast.
Thursday 29 May	Ascension Anthems (8.15am) The choir sings anthems from a high place in college to celebrate the Feast of the Ascension.
Tuesdays 13 May and 17 June	Compline (9.15pm) A peaceful candlelit service, sung by the choir, followed refreshments in A1.
Thursday 19 June	Choral Eucharist for Corpus Christi (6.15pm) A festal service to celebrate the gift of Holy Communion, followed by refreshments. We also welcome back alumni to this service.
Tuesday I July	Leavers' Service (6pm) A service to celebrate and given thanks for our graduands before the graduation dinner.
